Alton Glenn Miller (1904-1944) is recognized as one of the most successful musicians of the 20th century. His name has become synonymous with the "big band era" of the 1930s and 1940s and his music has come to be identified by many as the soundtrack of the World War II era.

Glenn Miller and his Orchestra (1937-1942) performed at ballrooms and hotels across the United States. They played for dances and events that were known as "one night stands."

Their hits included such classics as: the Mood, Moonlight Serenade, Tuxedo Junction, Pennsylvania 6-5000 and Chattanooga Choo-Choo!
