Glenn Miller and his Orchestra (1937-1942) performed at ballrooms and hotels across the United States. They played for dances and events that were known as

"one night stands."

the Mood, Moonlight Serenade, Tuxedo Junction,  
Pennsylvania 6-5000 and Chattanooga Choo-Choo!
